

## **AREA ATTRACTIONS:**

### **World's Only Winnetoon**

Only seven miles northwest of Creighton, visit the mini-mall of historic old west buildings and shopping. Check out chain-saw carvings and "Privy Path," as well as the Winnetoon Jail, which is listed on the National Registry of Historic Places.

### **Ashfall Fossil Beds State Historical Park**

Located 16 miles west of Creighton, Ashfall Fossil Beds State Historical Park is an ongoing paleontology excavation. See fossil remains of several species frozen in time for the last 10 million years in the Rhino Barn, which opened in 2009.

### **Grove Lake Wildlife Management Area**

Just 20 miles southwest of Creighton, Grove Lake offers fishing and several other recreational opportunities. Also, be sure to check out the Grove Lake Trout Rearing Station near the lake where visitors can feed various sizes of fish.
